**Benjamin Quiz**

Benjamins are three-letter front extension to five-letter words, so called after the French Scrabble player Benjamin Hannuna. For example, MISLEARN and OUTLEARN are benjamins of LEARN, and less obviously BARYONIC is a benjamin of YONIC. The word BENJAMIN is itself playable in Scrabble, but in the unrelated sense of a kind of overcoat, named after one Joseph Benjamin, a tailor.

I have rather a liking for benjamins and feel a special satisfaction when the opportunity comes up to play one, normally in response to an opponent's opening move starting from the left-hand double-letter square. Admittedly this doesn't happen very often, and it's probably not worth devoting too much time to the study of benjamins, though of course if you do decide to work your way through the lot you will undoubtedly gain simply from the fact of revising 2939 five-letter words in tandem with 9280 eight-letter words. You can add to this the fact that this kind of front extension can be quite difficult to spot, and some previous exposure to benjamins makes it a lot easier.

Anyway, to give you a taste for them and allow you to test your own benjamin power, here are twenty-five five-letter words that can all be prefixed with three other letters to give one and one only eight-letter word. Many of the eight-letter words are slightly obscure and I suspect that a moderately good player will be doing well to score ten.

OBITUARIES

Sadly we have received notice of a death since our last issue. Peggy was playing in the LSL in her 90's. Earlier she played in the Southern Counties League:

Peggy Snell born 26 December 1915 died 23 May 2010

Peggy who has recently died aged 94 began playing scrabble in the mid-1980's. She joined Carshalton Scrabble club, playing from time to time in the SCSL. Peggy was a member of a team I captained in the 1990's which was East Surrey Blue Tits - a joint Croydon and Carshalton team.

Peggy's father was a butler and her mother a cook. They moved around a lot and Peggy went to ten different schools. When she grew up Peggy became a parlour maid and the three of them worked together for various households.

In her early 30's Peggy met her husband who was a baker calling at the home where she was employed. After their marriage they bought up small failed businesses and turned them around. They were never afraid of hard work.

Peggy was widowed around 40 years ago and in 1971 started office work for the first time and worked in Wallington for Barbara Allan. Peggy and Barbara started playing scrabble and both joined the Carshalton Scrabble Club.

In recent years, Peggy found it difficult to attend weekly evening meetings and joined the LSL where she enjoyed hosting and having people come to play here in her own home.

Peggy is survived by one niece, Joyce Curran.

The venue was again the John Hanson School Sports Hall, affording plenty of space, light, tea and coffee, thanks to members of a very supportive School Society. Division B was won by Andy Gray, ahead on spread of local lass Wendy Lindridge. Out on top of Division C came Judy Young, bar one the lowest rated player there and also therefore holder of the Terry Hollington shield for 2010. Behind her, also on 5 wins, were Reeyaaz Goolamhossen and Peter Sime. Applause too for Maggie Fleming in C and Fay Goble in D, who also managed 5 wins but insufficient spread to be prize-winners.

He did however share with David Sutton the highest word score of the day, 140. Ruth MacInerney, also present, fore bore to pull another 311 out of the hat. There was also applause for Maureen Chamberlain, celebrating her (censored)th birthday.
